Hello Everyone

MAYOR'S

Hope all is well. We have certainly just experienced an exceptionally mild winter with it drawing to an end this week. It doesn't give much hope for what summer might present us, but for now we'll settle for a pleasant Spring.

McPhellamy's Crossing Update

Council were given permission to proceed with the project by the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries back in 2020. Following some early runs in the river the contractor was unable to complete the final stage, about the last third on the western bank. Since then, there have been multiple runs in the river preventing the contractor from returning. In the meantime, the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries have instructed Council to cease works until the crossing had a fish ladder incorporated into the design and an application go through the State Assessment and Referral Agency.

This process we have been advised will take a further couple of months to complete. The risk now is as we move into the summer months storms could fall causing more runs in the river preventing the contractor from completing the job this year. Best case scenario would be we get the approval to proceed before there are any runs in the river and the contractor returns to finish the job. To the contrary, the approval comes too late and we return after the wet in the new year. It has been a very unfortunate series of events and it is not lost on Council opportunities of securing water for Windorah are being missed. Council is currently working with a contractor to reinstate the boat ramp for the short term.

The following is the externally funded project status update:

- Windorah water treatment plant 12-month liability period has commenced
- Budgerygar floodway Earthworks and side track commencing this week
- Thomson River culverts Jundah due for completion early September
- Stonehenge water treatment plant new shed and filter upgrade plans are being finalised with procurement commencing

The following is an update of our work crews and their progress on roads around the Shire. Darren Mattheson's crew have completed prime on the Nildes Jump up rehabilitation job and the final seal will be done early September. Jason Beilby's crew have relocated to Bimerah Isisford Rd to commence the rehabilitation project.

The maintenance grader has completed Palpara Rd and will then do maintenance on Arrabury Rd. If there are sections of roads requiring immediate attention, please notify Council.

Contractor Crew have completed flood damage on Yaraka Retreat Rd and will continue onto Budgerygar Rd to do flood damage and a side track for the culvert upgrade.

Flying gang are currently assisting on the Bimerah Isisford Rd installing temporary grids.

Don't forget, Council meetings are open to the public and all community members are welcome. Council meetings are rotated around the three towns, and we notify via an online flyer of upcoming Council meeting dates and times. The next meeting will be held in Jundah on the 20th of September 2023.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

- Council received the 4th Quarter Operational Plan review for the 2022-23 financial year in accordance with Section 174 (3) of the Local Government Regulation 2012. This can be downloaded from our website https://www.barcoo.gld.gov.au/about-council/reports-and-publications/operational-plan
- Council approved the Revised Terms of Reference for the Rural Lands Advisory Committee.
- COUNCIL'S CHIRSTMAS CLOSURE:
- 1. Jundah Administration Office, the Jundah, Stonehenge and Windorah Information Centres and Libraries for the Christmas/New Year period from close of business on Wednesday 20 December 2023, reopening on Monday 8 January 2024, with a public notice of the closure provided.
- 2. Jundah Roadhouse will close on 25 and 26 December 2023 and 1 January 2024 with reduced hours from 27 December 2023 to 7 January 2024.

TOWN SERVICES REPORT

• Council undertake aerial baiting in late October/early November (dependent upon plane availability).

PROJECT AREA REPORT

• Council approves the procurement of bitumen surfacing works in the first half of 2023/24 through Local Buy Arrangement BUS270, under Section 234 of the Local Government Regulation 2012, and: 2. Delegates the Chief Executive Officer to form a Contract, to provide the required services, in accordance with Section 257 of the Local Government Act 2009 and Item 232 the Barcoo Shire Register of Delegations to the CEO.

The Barcoo Shire Council holds its next Ordinary Meeting on Wednesday 20 September 2023 at the **Jundah Board Room, commencing at 8:00am.** Council meetings are open to the public. Councillors and the Chief Executive Officer would like to extend an invitation to members of the community to join them for morning tea, commencing at 10:30am. This is an excellent opportunity to meet with Councillors and senior Council staff to discuss ideas or matters of concern you may have. Council encourages community engagement and interest, and we hope to see members of the community at our Council meetings or joining us for morning tea.

Windorah Aerodrome Runway Upgrade 11 October – 15 December 2023

The Barcoo Shire Council wish to advise residents that the Windorah Airport will be closed from 11 October – 15 December 2023, to undertake critical works in the upgrade of the runway. Council apologise for any inconvenience during this time. A bus service will operate between Windorah and Quilpie to coincide with flight times. We are working with Transport and Main Roads and Rex Airlines and more information will be delivered in the coming weeks.

The RFDS (Queensland Section) will continue to service the Windorah region while the Windorah airstrip is closed for maintenance for the three months from October.

The RFDS will use the Ourdel Station airstrip to ensure both primary health care clinics and aeromedical services remain accessible for the community.

Weekly clinics will remain unaffected and on schedule during this time, and aeromedical operations will continue to run 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

In the event of wet weather, the RFDS has an alternative runway option to ensure limited disruption to services.

A maximum of 2 dogs per house applies without a permit. All dogs must be registered after 3 months of age or within: 14 days of acquiring the dog or 28 days of becoming a new resident of the region. An application for a permit to keep additional dogs can be lodged with Council. A permit will only be issued if your application is approved.


