Hello Everyone

Hope all is well. November has brought some good falls throughout the shire, though it is very patchy. We have seen a run in the rivers from local and upper catchment falls and more to come. It is quite contrary to the predicted El Nino though, so let's hope the current moisture attracts some more rain through December and into the new year.

Earlier this month Fiona Quirk, Chief Fire Warden for Rural Fire Service Qld presented Ted and Jill Fitzgerald medals for 34 and 31 years' service respectively as volunteers of the Rural Fire Brigade at various locations in the shire. Thankfully they haven't had to fight large numbers of fires but have always kept their training up to date and made themselves available in the event of a fire. Thank you Ted and Jill for your devotion to volunteering. Along with the presentation the Jundah rural fire truck was on display with a new safety addition, it's a water spray system called a halo that turns on in the event of a burn over protecting the operators inside the cab.

#### A message from Telstra

Back in 2019 we announced that we'd be closing our 3G network, which you also know as the Telstra Next G network. Doing so allows us to repurpose the 3G spectrum to offer better coverage and reliability on our 4G and 5G mobile network. #### **Windorah Airport**

The Windorah airstrip rehabilitation project is progressing well considering about 60mm of rain in the last couple of weeks. The stabilisation will be complete early December followed by final trim and shoulder works. Prime and seal has been booked in for the 10th December followed by line marking and lighting. Whilst the airport is closed the terminal building is being upgraded for compliance purposes. The project is due for completion by the 15 December with REX returning on the 18th December.

#### WITH SALLY O'NEIL

#### The following is the externally funded project status update:

- Windorah water treatment plant 12-month liability period has commenced
- Budgerygar floodway half way through but delays due to rain
- Stonehenge water treatment plant new shed and filter upgrade contractor due on site in the new year to incorporate current alarm system with new filter system
- Water meter installation replacement of faulty meters commenced in Jundah, Windorah and Stonehenge to follow in the new year

The following is an update of our work crews and their progress on roads around the Shire.

- Dave Ross's crew have been doing shoulders on Windorah Jundah Rd and to ensure continuity of the Windorah airstrip working there on Jason Beilby's days off. The crew will return from break and do flood damage on Lina Glen Rd up until the Christmas break. The Bimerah Isisford Rd stabilisation project is on hold due to both crews concentrating on the Windorah airstrip project.
- Jason Beilby's crew are working on the rehabilitation project at the Windorah airstrip.
- The maintenance grader in currently on Palparara Rd and then will move onto Whitula Tanbar Rd. *If there are sections of roads requiring immediate attention, please notify Council.*
- Contractor Crew are doing flood damage on Jundah Winton Rd near Mayne crossing.
- Concrete contractor crew are doing a driveway at Jundah cabins
- Flying gang are currently on the bulk signage project between Windorah and Quilpie.

Don't forget, Council meetings are open to the public and all community members are welcome. Council meetings are rotated around the three towns, and we notify via an online flyer of upcoming Council meeting dates and times. The next meeting will be held in Jundah on the 15th of December 2023.

## Windorah Aerodrome Runway Upgrade 11 October - 15 December 2023

The Barcoo Shire Council wish to advise residents that the Windorah Airport will be closed from 11 October – 15 December 2023, to undertake critical works in the upgrade of the runway. Council apologise for any inconvenience during this time. A bus service will operate between Windorah and Quilpie to coincide with flight times.

The bus will run 4 times a week (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday) as per our general plane days. The below snip is straight from the "Emergency Services Contract" between Translink (DTMR) and Council.

The RFDS (Queensland Section) will continue to service the Windorah region while the Windorah airstrip is closed for maintenance for the three months from October.

The RFDS will use the Ourdel Station airstrip to ensure both primary health care clinics and aeromedical services remain accessible for the community. Weekly clinics will remain unaffected and on schedule during this time, and aeromedical operations will continue to run 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Air mail and freight will continue as normal, this will now be collected off the plane in Quilpie.

In the event of wet weather, the RFDS has an alternative runway option to ensure limited disruption to services.

#### **DOG REGISTRATION**

Dog registration is now overdue, if you have not made payment yet, please contact Council to make these. A maximum of 2 dogs per house applies without a permit. All dogs must be registered after 3 months of age or within: 14 days of acquiring the dog or 28 days of becoming a new resident of a region. An application for a permit to keep additional dogs can be lodged to Council. A permit will only be issued if your application is approved. If your animal is in no longer in the Shire, please let us know so we can update your details.
