Hello Everyone

Hope all is well. October certainly presented us with a mixed bag, hot days, cool days, southerly gusty winds and a brief spray of thunderstorms in the eastern parts. Everything bar rain. The predicted bush fire season is impacting parts of the state to the south and east of here. This has resulted in the smoke haze we have seen of late drifting many hundreds of kilometres.

Just to be alert but not alarmed, COVID has reared its head back in the Barcoo Shire. Several office staff have tested positive in the past week. Protocols around COVID have been lifted but it is advisable if you feel unwell and suffering symptoms get tested and let's not share the bug.

The Windorah airstrip rehabilitation project is progressing well considering the rock that was encountered. The stabiliser has commenced and will be complete early November which will be completion of subgrade. This will be followed by the import of gravel for the base layer which is expected to be completed by the end of November. Early December will see the commencement of the spray seal and line marking. Whilst the airport is closed the terminal building is being upgraded for compliance purposes. The project is due for completion by the 15 December.

Stonehenge hosted the Dirty Fame Flash Candles Club entertainment night recently. The event was well attended and thoroughly enjoyed by all. Thank you to STAG for providing the catering and bar.

Recently the CEO Mike Lollback, Cr Pidgeon, Cr Jackson and I attended the 127th LGAQ conference in Gladstone. The official opening of the conference was done by The Queensland Premier, the Hon. Annastacia Palaszczuk. The Premier announced the Works for Queensland program would be extended, there will be \$300 million over the next 3 years. This program is very welcomed by LGA's and councils had been campaigning for the program to continue and for funding to be restored back to \$100 million a year.

A presentation on "The Invisible Enemy: Queensland Councils' Cyber Saga". Blackall Tambo Regional Council Mayor and CEO and Isaac Regional Council Mayor and CEO retold their experiences following a Cyber attack on their Councils' technology systems. It was stated it was like the lights had been turned out overnight and they were back to doing their day to day business the old way such as writing out cheques for payroll. They were dealing with an unknown person on the other side of the world withholding their information. Fortunately, IT providers were able to negotiate on behalf of the Councils' and over a period of months business was restored to normal. Queensland Government representatives were at the conference offering LG's free Cyber security through the Cyber Enhancement Program. Certainly, quite an alarming presentation that all LG's and businesses are vulnerable to.

Council Segments

Somerset Regional Council showcased their Rail Trail through the Brisbane Valley and success it has brought to small business in the Region through the substantial increase in visitation. A great economic development initiative.

Mackay Regional Council have introduced a young Mayors program where people under 17 can get elected by their counterparts to a youth cabinet. The youth cabinet will work with Council identifying issues that may impact their future by defining priority areas and implementing projects and events.

Yarrabah Aboriginal Shire Council shared the details of their microgrid. Throughout the wet season Yarrabah is subject to power outages due to the one power feed coming from Cairns. They are currently in the process of introducing a microgrid that will ensure certainty in their power supply.

Palm Island Aboriginal Shire Council shared how they were tackling youth crime. They have introduced a program where they have their own indigenous night patrol staff wondering the streets talking to young ones to curb their crime rates. This has proven to be very successful with a 90% reduction in crime.

Ethridge Shire Council shared the Kidston Project, the use of two disused gold mine pits for hydroelectric power generation. It's an inspiring story for Kidston from being once a mining town and now being transformed into a modern renewable energy hub.

Isaac Regional Council shared their story on the fight to save Glenden. Many of Qld's LG's wrote letters of support to the Premier and state departments, this shared advocacy assisted in a positive result for Glendan.

Virtual Federal update from Hon Kristy McBain, Minister for Regional Development, Local Government and the Territories discussing current partnerships in place with local and federal government and funding for local government disaster preparations.

Opposition update from David Crisafulli outlining LNP's intentions if they get in at the next election of working closely with Local Government, understanding that LG's are closer to the people and know what is needed. Cost shifting presentation by LGAQ following on from a survey that has been conducted by 75% of Qld Councils revealing there has been a 378% increase in cost shifting from the State Government onto councils and their communities over the last 20 years. This issue impacts all Councils in Qld, even one's you wouldn't imagine such as Brisbane City Council. There were 152 motions up for debate.

Prior to the GALA dinner there was an awards ceremony which saw Charters Towers Regional Council win the Butch Lenton Memorial Award along with several councillors being recognised for their years of service ranging from 10 to 30 years. CEO's Des Howard from Blackall Tambo Regional Council and Mark Crawley Carpentaria Shire Council both recognised for 45 years as CEO's retiring at the next election.

The following is the externally funded project status update:

- Windorah water treatment plant 12-month liability period has commenced
- Budgerygar floodway works commenced
- Thomson River culverts Jundah Completed, temporary grid to be removed
- Stonehenge water treatment plant new shed and filter upgrade contractor due on site to incorporate current alarm system with new filter system
- Water meter installation replacement of faulty meters commenced in Jundah, Windorah and Stonehenge to follow in the new year
- **REMINDER:** Department of Agriculture and Fisheries have instructed Council to cease works at McPhellamys Crossing until the crossing had a fish ladder incorporated into the design and an application go through the State Assessment and Referral Agency. This process we have been advised will take a further couple of months to complete. The risk now is as we move into the summer months storms could fall causing more runs in the river preventing the contractor from completing the job this year. Best case scenario would be we get the approval to proceed before there are any runs in the river and the contractor returns to finish the job. To the contrary, the approval comes too late and we return after the wet in the new year. It has been a very unfortunate series of events and it is not lost on Council opportunities of securing water for Windorah are being missed.

The following is an update of our work crews and their progress on roads around the Shire.

- Dave Ross's crew are doing shoulders on Windorah Quilpie Rd and to ensure continuity of the Windorah airstrip working there on Jason Beilby's days off. The Bimerah Isisford Rd stabilisation project is on hold due to both crews concentrating on the Windorah airstrip project.
- Jason Beilby's crew are working on the rehabilitation project at the Windorah airstrip.
- The maintenance grader in currently on the Moorabree Rd and then will move onto Palparara Rd. (If there are sections of roads requiring immediate attention, please notify Council.)
- Contractor Crew are doing flood damage on Jundah Winton Rd near Mayne crossing.
- Concrete contractor crew are doing culverts and driveway at the Windorah Water Treatment Plant.
- Flying gang are currently on the bulk signage project between Windorah and Quilpie.

Don't forget, Council meetings are open to the public and all community members are welcome. Council meetings are rotated around the three towns, and we notify via an online flyer of upcoming Council meeting dates and times. The next meeting will be held in Jundah on the 15th of November 2023.

Windorah Aerodrome Runway Upgrade 11 October - 15 December 2023

The Barcoo Shire Council wish to advise residents that the Windorah Airport will be closed from 11 October – 15 December 2023, to undertake critical works in the upgrade of the runway. Council apologise for any inconvenience during this time. A bus service will operate between Windorah and Quilpie to coincide with flight times.

The bus will run 4 times a week (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday) as per our general plane days. The below snip is straight from the "Emergency Services Contract" between Translink (DTMR) and Council.

The RFDS (Queensland Section) will continue to service the Windorah region while the Windorah airstrip is closed for maintenance for the three months from October.

The RFDS will use the Ourdel Station airstrip to ensure both primary health care clinics and aeromedical services remain accessible for the community. Weekly clinics will remain unaffected and on schedule during this time, and aeromedical operations will continue to run 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Air mail and freight will continue as normal, this will now be collected off the plane in Quilpie.

In the event of wet weather, the RFDS has an alternative runway option to ensure limited disruption to services.

WILD DOG BAITING

Aerial Baiting - Monday 30 October to Friday 3 November 2023

The Barcoo Shire Coordinated Wild Dog Baiting Program is being undertaken from 29 October – 3 November 2023 on properties within the Barcoo Shire. Council will be aerial baiting as well as some ground baiting during this time.

- Visitors and local community members are to be vigilant with their pets during baiting periods and take caution whilst travelling around the shire.
- 1080 baits can remain active for long periods on properties adjacent to main roads and other road networks within the Shire boundary.
- Be aware of the possibility that these baits can be transferred by wildlife from baited areas to non-baited areas such as our town commons, reserves, and road related areas.
- Please ensure you do not take your pets onto private property without first contacting the owner/manager.


