

#### WITH SALLY O'NEIL



Hello Everyone

Hope all is well. September certainly gave us a dose of what is yet to come. Gusty winds, higher than average temperatures and no rain was predicted and proved not to be too wrong with Australia having its driest September on record. Let's hope for a cool change before Spring slips away and the inevitable summer temperatures arrive.

The residents of Windorah have been experiencing failings with the 3G and 4G network for some time. I have been able to raise this with the General Manager for Regional Australia who has been exceptionally helpful in responding to residents' concerns.

A fault has been identified and technicians will be in Windorah in the next couple of weeks to rectify. Below is two simple dot points that can assist people whilst Telstra work on the issue and anytime as a backup.

- Most modern EFTPOS terminals can use Wi-Fi linking into fixed network services and/or mobile service to operate effectively. We recommend you contact your bank to check what EFTPOS facility you have.
- Wi-Fi Calling If you have a Telstra mobile with a compatible device, you'll be able to make voice calls using your Fixed Broadband Wi-Fi connection. <a href="https://www.telstra.com.au/coverage-networks/mobile-technology#wificalling">https://www.telstra.com.au/coverage-networks/mobile-technology#wificalling</a>

At the end of October we will have a PhD Student in Windorah who successfully received a Justin Costello Lake Eyre Grant from the Dept. of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water. The purpose of the trip will be to deploy auditory detection devices (4) along Coopers Creek. The proposed project involves using remote sensing devices (to collect audio and water quality measurements) together with cloud-based machine learning (Al). The goal is to identify frog/toad species calls and correlate the identified species distribution with water quality indicators.

You may be aware the Department of Resources has been consulting extensively with various stakeholders regarding several actions identified in the Queensland Resources Industry Development Plan (QRIDP).

- a review of Queensland's land access and coexistence institutions;
- reforms to regulatory framework for small-scale mining; and
- a more effective and efficient regulatory framework for the resources sector.

The department has considered the feedback received to date to refine the proposals and determine the legislative changes required to implement these reforms. Government is now preparing to consult further on a range of regulatory reforms before a bill is introduced into Parliament early next year.

The department released three consultation papers on 27 September 2023, which seek feedback on proposals to:

- strengthen Queensland's coexistence institutions and subsidence management framework;
- enhance the regulatory framework for mining claims; and
- improve regulatory efficiency for the resource sector.

#### The following is the externally funded project status update:

- Windorah water treatment plant 12-month liability period has commenced
- Budgerygar floodway Delayed, works proposed to begin mid-October
- Thomson River culverts Jundah Delayed, due for completion mid-October
- Stonehenge water treatment plant new shed and filter upgrade plans are being finalised with procurement commencing

The following is an update of our work crews and their progress on roads around the Shire. Dave Ross's crew have completed the Nildes Jump up rehabilitation job. They have relocated to Bimerah Isisford Rd stabilisation project. Jason Beilby's crew have relocated to Windorah to commence the rehabilitation project on the airstrip.

The maintenance grader in currently on the bottom end of Arrabury Rd. If there are sections of roads requiring immediate attention, please notify Council.

Contractor Crew are doing flood damage on Jundah Winton Rd near Mayne crossing. Flying gang are currently on the bulk signage project between Windorah and Quilpie.

Don't forget, Council meetings are open to the public and all community members are welcome. Council meetings are rotated around the three towns, and we notify via an online flyer of upcoming Council meeting dates and times. The next

meeting will be held in Jundah on the 25th of October 2023.

## Windorah Aerodrome Runway Upgrade 11 October - 15 December 2023

The Barcoo Shire Council wish to advise residents that the Windorah Airport will be closed from 11 October – 15 December 2023, to undertake critical works in the upgrade of the runway. Council apologise for any inconvenience during this time. A bus service will operate between Windorah and Quilpie to coincide with flight times.

The bus will run 4 times a week (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday) as per our general plane days. The below snip is straight from the "Emergency Services Contract" between Translink (DTMR) and Council.

The RFDS (Queensland Section) will continue to service the Windorah region while the Windorah airstrip is closed for maintenance for the three months from October.

The RFDS will use the Ourdel Station airstrip to ensure both primary health care clinics and aeromedical services remain accessible for the community. Weekly clinics will remain unaffected and on schedule during this time, and aeromedical operations will continue to run 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Air mail and freight will continue as normal, this will now be collected off the plane in Quilpie.

In the event of wet weather, the RFDS has an alternative runway option to ensure limited disruption to services.

#### WILD DOG BAITING

#### Aerial Baiting - Sunday 29 October to Friday 3 November 2023

The Barcoo Shire Coordinated Wild Dog Baiting Program is being undertaken from 29 October – 3 November 2023 on properties within the Barcoo Shire. Council will be aerial baiting as well as some ground baiting during this time.

- Visitors and local community members are to be vigilant with their pets during baiting periods and take caution whilst travelling around the shire.
- 1080 baits can remain active for long periods on properties adjacent to main roads and other road networks within the Shire boundary.
- Be aware of the possibility that these baits can be transferred by wildlife from baited areas to non-baited areas such as our town commons, reserves, and road related areas.
- Please ensure you do not take your pets onto private property without first contacting the owner/manager.

#### ERGON ENERGY UPDATE

Hello again!

As we mentioned in our last Barcoo Banter update in June, we've sadly reached the end of an era for the solar concentrators at the Windorah Solar Farm. Commissioned in 2008, the solar concentrator farm was Ergon's first ever solar farm trial and has been an iconic symbol of Windorah for the past 15 years.

While solar concentrators were state of the art renewable energy technology at the turn of the century, significant advances in solar PV and batteries in the last couple of decades, mean that they are no longer the most efficient way to meet Windorah's long-term energy needs.

After a slight delay to the original decommissioning timeline, the solar concentrator removal, site demolition and earth works are scheduled to commence on site on 9 October 2023 and will take about 3 weeks to complete. During this time the solar concentrators will be deconstructed and removed off site where parts will be recycled. The site will then be cleared in preparation for the new solar farm and battery. Please be on the lookout for some extra trucks and machinery in the area during this time.

Speaking of the new solar and battery farm, the Queensland government formally announced Windorah, and three other solar projects, in a joint media statement from the Minister for Transport and Main Roads and Minister for Digital Services, the Honourable Mark Bailey, and the Minister for Energy, Renewables and Hydrogen and Minister for Public Works and Procurement, the Honourable Mick de Brenni. The Ministers' announced:

- The Palaszczuk Government's 2023-24 Budget is delivering \$28 million to take Boulia, Burketown, Doomadgee, and Windorah off expensive fossilfuelled power.
- These projects will see solar generation and battery storage systems contributing renewable energy to the generation mix of the four power stations, supporting the reduction of diesel usage.
- Windorah: Ergon Energy Network is planning to install 850kW of solar PV and 1,000kWh of energy storage, which will save 150,000 litres of diesel and \$300,000 each year.

• The projects will also create direct and indirect jobs in these communities, as part of the Queensland Energy and Jobs Plan.

The new solar farm and battery will ensure over half of Windorah's total power is sourced from renewable energy, and we have longer term plans to see this figure go to 100% renewable energy by 2040. This project demonstrates our commitment to remote and regional communities and will ensure that Windorah remains at the forefront of the transition to a renewable energy future.

We wanted to say thanks to the Barcoo Shire Council and community for allowing us to serve you in this way, and we look forward to our next visit back to your region. Personally, I (Andrew) can't wait to get back to the schools and talk more about the new Windorah Solar Farm project and renewable energy and see how we can all save power in our homes and communities.

#### SO YOU WANT TO BE A COUNCILLOR?



In the coming months the department will also begin face-to-face sessions around the state for anyone wishing to complete the training in person.

The training takes approximately 90 minutes to complete. It explains the obligations and responsibilities of nominees for election and contains information about the recently legislated election expenditure caps.
