The following is the externally funded project status update:

- Windorah water treatment plant 12-month liability period has commenced
- Budgerygar floodway delays due to weather
- Stonehenge water treatment plant new shed and filter upgrade contractor due on site to incorporate current alarm system with new filter system
- Water meter installation replacement of faulty meters continuing in Jundah, Windorah and Stonehenge

The following is an update of our work crews and their progress on roads around the Shire. Dave Ross's crew have returned from break and are on the Lina Glen Rd doing flood damage. Jason Beilby's crew have returned to continue working on the Bimerah Isisford Rd project. The maintenance grader is currently on the Jundah Quilpie Rd doing maintenance. If there are sections of roads requiring immediate attention, please notify Council.

Contractor Crew are doing flood damage on Palparara Rd. Flying gang have been working on the bulk signage project between Windorah and Quilpie.

Don't forget, Council meetings are open to the public and all community members are welcome. Council meetings are rotated around the three towns, and we notify via an online flyer of upcoming Council meeting dates and times. The next meeting will be held in Jundah on the 21st of February 2024.

The types of skills you will develop will depend on the course selected, they may include carrying out manual excavation, manually spread and compact materials, support plant operations, basic levelling, repair potholes, opportunity to gain licences for various types of plant, first aid and CPR etc.

Trainees will work with our construction crews across the Barcoo Shire including the townships of Jundah, Stonehenge and Windorah.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

- Council approved the change of date for the March Meeting Ordinary Meeting of Council from Wednesday 20 March to Wednesday 13 March 2024.
- Council adopted the Local Government Remuneration Commission's Schedule (2021-22), for remuneration to: The Mayor, Deputy Mayor, and Councillors of Barcoo Shire Council, commencing July 2024.

OPERATIONAL WORKS REPORT

COUNCIL CONSTRUCTED DAM AGREEMENT.

Council approved to: 1. approach property owners identified in select areas where water availability is of particular concern to discuss acceptance of Council Constructed Dam Access Agreement. Properties considered particularly critical include all affected properties west of Windorah as these are largely isolated from river systems (as per 'Select Western Properties Map'); AND 2. use Council Constructed Dam Access Agreement template for future constructed dams or other access agreements.

CLOSED MATTERS

• Council accepted the tender from Tutt Bryant Pty Ltd and authorise the CEO to enter into a large-sized contractual arrangement with them in accordance with Section 226 of the Local Government Regulation 2012.

The Barcoo Shire Council holds its next Ordinary Meeting on Wednesday 21 February 2024 at the **Jundah Board Room, commencing at 8:00am.** Council meetings are open to the public. Councillors and the Chief Executive Officer would like to extend an invitation to members of the community to join them for morning tea, commencing at 10:30am. This is an excellent opportunity to meet with Councillors and senior Council staff to discuss ideas or matters of concern you may have. Council encourages community engagement and interest, and we hope to see members of the community at our Council meetings or joining us for morning tea.

JANUARY 24, 2024 - SPECIAL MEETING

- **CEO CONTRACT.** Council authorised the Mayor to amend and extend the CEO's contract with a revised remuneration from August 29, 2024, to February 28, 2025, inclusive.
- JUNDAH ROADHOUSE LEASE. Council authorises the Chief Executive Officer to finalise and enter into a three-year lease agreement with a three-year renewal option for the Jundah Roadhouse with Darren Hall and Susan Briggs.

Upcoming Council Auction

Barcoo Shire Council is taking part in a combined auction with Western Councils. The Auction will be conducted online at Nasco commencing on 18 March 2024 at 10am and concluding on 21 March 2024, 12pm.

Police are reminding drivers and owners of vehicles to ensure that their vehicles are well maintained and compliant with regulations covering modifications.

Care and Maintenance of vehicles should be a priority when transporting children back for the new school year.





1. Vehicle modifications

Owners sometimes modify their vehicles to give them a distinctive appearance, to improve their performance, to add desired features, change the engine (alternate or replacement engines), suspension, or to add a long-range fuel tank. Others modify their vehicles so that they are better suited to a specialised purpose.


Vehicle owners who wish to modify their vehicles need to follow the vehicle standards guidelines and relevant approved codes of practice that apply to the modification of vehicles.

Modification plans may need to be reviewed and approved before the modification is made. If this is needed, a fee may be payable.**

2. School Speed Zones

Along with the new school year starting is the reintroduction of School Speed Zones. Be aware that children will be walking or riding push bikes to school and compliance with the speed zones will ensure safety of the children.

Police will be monitoring traffic behaviours around school zones at the commencement of the school year.



2024 LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS

Notice of Election for the March 2024 Local Government Elections has been published. Candidate nominations are now open, and other key dates in the timetable include:

- Close of electoral roll Monday 5 February 2024
- Candidate nominations close Tuesday 12pm, 13 February 2024
- Election day Saturday 16 March 2024

All voting for the Barcoo Shire will be conducted via postal votes, apply for a postal vote by **4 March** on the ECQ website.


Enrolling to vote

Now is also the time to make sure your enrolment details are up to date. If you're not on the electoral roll, you can't have your say. Visit aec.gov.au to enrol to vote or update your details. If you have teenagers in your life who will turn 18 before or on 16 March (election day) you can also help them get ready to vote. All eligible 16 and 17-year-olds can provisionally enrol now, which means that when they turn 18, they're automatically enrolled to vote. Make voting quicker and easier! All Queenslanders on the electoral roll (except full postal council areas and electors who are special postal voters) will receive a Voter Information Card in the mail before the elections. That's the big maroon card that you may recall receiving before previous state and local elections. Bringing this card with you when you go to vote will help you to get in and out of the polling booth quicker.
